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TAWNEY CEMETERY HISTORY REVEALED IN EARLY RECORDS

An interesting old secretary's journal, which contains the by-laws and minutes of all the meetings of the Pleasant View cemetery association in Willow Creek precinct, from the time of its organization, April 21, 1883, until the present day was being studied this week by those making records for the Pierce County Historical Society. Although Pleasant View is the original name of this cemetery located 12 miles west of Pierce, it is most frequently referred to as the Tawney Cemetery.

The organization meeting was held at the August Lambrecht homestead, one acre in the northwest corner of his farm being exchanged for a lot in the newly formed association. The lots were eighteen feet square and until May 15, 1883, could be purchased for \$1.50 each. After that date they were \$2.50. Four lots in the southeast corner were set aside as a potters field. Originally the annual meetings were scheduled for the first Saturday in March, but in later years have been held on Memorial Day.

Three trustees were chosen to serve. Joseph Forsythe was selected as the first chairman; Rufus Tawney secretary and Herman Steinkraus as the third member. On March 8, 1884 at the annual meeting, August Lambrecht was named the first treasurer.

The charter members of this cemetery association who purchased lots for \$1.50 each were: August Lambrecht, in exchange for one acre of ground, Rufus Tawney, Joseph Forsythe, Fred Rautenberg, Julius Schultz, Chris Schram, R. H. Smith, Frank Birch, D. Kuether Sr., Carl Leisner, Herman Steinkraus, Albert Steinkraus, L. L. Poynter, Charles Ulrich, August Heyer, S. W. Kincaid, George W. Kincaid, I. C. Barnes and L. A. Barnes. The last two names were later cancelled. A revised list of lot owners in 1906 contains 66 names.

At the annual meeting at the Tawney school house on March 11, 1899, the by-laws were amended to raise the price of lots to \$4.50, the report of F. Birch, secretary shows. In May, 1923 they were raised to \$10. R. A. Tawney was secretary of the association for many years. In his report of the meeting at his home October 1, 1883, Mr. Forsythe was authorized to buy a two string barb wire fence for the grounds and August Lambrecht was to build it for \$3. At this meeting the deed to the ground was accepted as acknowledged by Aug. Lambrecht and wife and given to chairman Forsythe to record. The following March the trustees were instructed to meet in Pierce on April 1, to acknowledge deeds to all cemetery lots to date.

In 1894 red cedar stakes were placed to mark lots at a cost of \$3.15. In February, 1895 one dollar was paid for a frame and glass for the plot of the cemetery drawn by hand by W. E. Bishop when he surveyed the land in 1883. The original frame and plat were recently brought to the court house by E. A. Lambrecht, a son of the homesteader on whose land the cemetery was laid out, who later owned the land and disposed of it only last fall. The records show Mr. Bishop received \$5 for making the survey.

In 1895 a fire line was plowed about the grounds and Frank Birch was paid \$4.50 for trees and planting them out. In 1898 a woven wire fence and posts were constructed about the grounds at a cost of \$156.81. The old wooden fence was sold to Robert Ruhlow for \$10.75. Thirty lot owners were assessed \$4.45 each to pay for the new fence. It was also decided to buy a half acre east of the cemetery for hitching posts. In 1910 it was voted to replace the red cedar marking stakes with bricks set one inch above the ground. Another item was \$1.25 for grass seed.

In 1917 the board of trustees elected were all women, Mrs. Mary Voecks, chairman; Mrs. Jane Birch, secretary, and Miss

Sophia Keller, treasurer. A dinner was served May 29 which netted the association \$3. In the succeeding year items for work and improvements at the cemetery show that it was given much care. By this time as much as \$4 and \$5 was paid for cutting the grass.

In 1924 Frank Voecks was instructed to mark all unmarked graves and clean the cemetery. Later he was named caretaker. In 1929 an assessment of one dollar on each lot was levied for upkeep. In 1928 a lawn mower was purchased. In 1933 the lot owners were instructed to take care of their lots. About that time Mr. and Mrs. Frank Voecks moved to Creston and since then the association has not been very active in looking after the cemetery. Mrs. Voecks was said to be the moving spirit in looking after the plot where her parents and many of the early Willow Creek residents were buried. In 1935 through the Pierce County Historical Society this old cemetery was restored.

The present officers are Ernest Lambrecht, chairman; Henry Kuhl, treasurer and Homer Birch secretary. Others who have served as officers not before named were: S. W. Kincaid, L. L. Poynter, M. E. King, Robert Ruhlow, Daniel Kerr, J. R. Smith, Q. H. Mundorf, I. C. Barnes, Theodore Synovec, Fred Synovec and Albert Buss.

The book in which this long time record has been kept is still in good shape and only partly used. It cost \$1.55 including some stationery for the use of the secretary. The foregoing account gives an idea of times and conditions in the early history of our county.

The treasurer reported a balance on hand of \$368.31. The report was accepted.

A motion was made and seconded that \$15.00 per each mowing be allowed in the future.

Mr. Weeks ask to be refused from the mowing, but not

finding anyone else he agreed to show it for the balance of the year.

A motion was made and seconded that a new fence be put around the cemetery. The fence was to consist of five barbed wire on three sides and an ornamental fence & gate on the front ^{part}.

A committee consisting of John Garlett, Albert B. Ross and Harry Birch was appointed by the Chairman to see that the fence was put in.

The idea of the Perpetual Care Plan was explained by Herbert Weeks. It was said that the money could be put into bonds or into a corporation.

In the United Fund Co-Operation we must raise \$2,500 and the dividends

would be payed four times
a year.

The motion was made and
seconded that we try to
collect 2500 toward perpetual
Care in which \$100.00 pledge
per lot would be given.
A lot means rook for eight.

The motion was made
and seconded that the
meeting be Adjourned.

to take care of this.

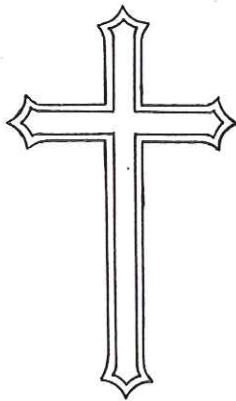

Pleasant View was the original name of this cemetery, located 14 miles west of Pierce in Willow Creek precinct. It was frequently referred to as the Tawney cemetery. This is due to the fact that church services were held across the road in the Tawney school, located on a corner of the Tawney ranch.

On April 21, 1883, the organizational meeting was held at the August Lambrecht homestead, one acre in the northwest corner of his farm being exchanged for a lot in the newly formed association. The lots were eighteen feet square and until May 15, 1883, could be purchased for \$1.50 each. After that date they were \$2.50. Four lots in the southeast corner were set aside as a potter's field. Originally, the annual meetings were scheduled for the first Saturday in March, but in later years have been held on the Sunday before Memorial Day.

Three trustees were originally chosen to serve. Joseph Forsythe was selected as the first chairman, Rufus Tawney as secretary, and Herman Steinkraus as a third member. On March 8, 1884, at the annual meeting, August Lambrecht was named the first treasurer.

The charter members of this cemetery association who purchased lots for \$1.50 were: August Lambrecht (in exchange for one acre of ground), Rufus Tawney, Joseph Forsythe, Fred Rautenberg, Julius Schultz, Chris Schram, R. H. Smith, Frank Birch, D. Kuether Sr., Carl Leisner, Herman Steinkraus, Albert Steinkraus, L. L. Poynter, Charles Ulrich, August Heyer, S. W. Kincaid, George W. Kincaid, I. C. Barnes, and L. A. Barnes.

On October 1, 1883, the deed to the ground was accepted and acknowledged that August Lambrecht and wife had given the land to the cemetery.

In 1884, red cedar stakes were placed to mark lots at a cost of \$3.10. In February, 1895, one dollar was paid for a frame and glass for the plot of the cemetery, drawn by hand by W. E. Bishop when he surveyed the land in 1883.

Mr. Bishop received \$5.00 for making the survey.

In 1885, a fire line was plowed and Frank Birch was paid \$4.50 for trees and planting them out. In 1898, a woven wire fence and posts were constructed about the grounds at a cost of \$156.81.

In 1917, the board of trustees elected were all women: Mrs. Mary Voecks, chairman; Mrs. Jane Birch, secretary; and Miss Sophia Keller, treasurer.

Other officers in the coming years were names such as S. W. Kincaid, L. L. Poynter, M. E. King, Robert Ruhlow, Daniel Kerr, J. R. Smith, Q. H. Mundorf, I. C. Barnes, Theodore Synovec, Fred Synovec, Albert Buss, Ernest Lambrecht, Henry Kuhl, and Homer Birch.

In 1924, Frank Voecks was instructed to mark all unmarked graves and clean the cemetery. Later he was named caretaker. Mr. and Mrs. Frank Voecks were very active in the association, and Mrs. Voecks was said to be the moving spirit in looking after the plot where her parents and many of the early Willow Creek residents were buried.

In May, 1939, the name of the cemetery was officially changed to Lambrecht Cemetery by officers and members of the association, who felt that this recognition was due the Lambrecht family. The following year, 1940, the Pierce County Historical Society erected a bronze plaque on a native boulder commemorating this pioneer cemetery. A short program was held at that time.

The Roy Synovecs started mowing the cemetery in 1958 and have been doing so ever since.

As of 1975, there were 102 stones in the cemetery. Price of the lots is now \$50.00.

In 1980, Mrs. Roy Synovec was honored for being president of the organization for thirty years.

Since a new map of the cemetery was needed, in 1981 Arlen Voecks spent many long hours drawing and plotting a new map. Several copies were made by him.

In 1982, a new entrance arch made of steel and bearing the words "Lambrecht Cemetery 1883-1983" was donated by Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Voecks, a grandson of the original donor of the cemetery, August Lambrecht. It was erected by Herbert and Gary Voecks of Grand Island and Arlen Voecks and Charles Price of Pierce.

In 1983, the cemetery is 100 years old. On June 17, a dedication program was held for the new arch. The present officers are: Mrs. Roy Synovec, president; Mrs. Clarence Suckstorf, treasurer; and Mrs. Jack Hoffman, secretary.

Some of the latest burials in the past ten years have been: Albert Buss, Martin Suckstorf, Frank Feneke, Mrs. Spath, Melvin Voecks, Gwyn Synovec, Rose Synovec, Frank Eickburger, Anton Synovec, and the most recent (this year), Arlen Voecks, also a grandson of the original donor of the cemetery.

1984

The meeting was opened with a prayer by the Chairman Betty Lesner and a poem by Wenell Duckert.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Treasurers report showed a balance of \$105.16. She was instructed to keep taking the interest of our money market certificate at the bank that should be enough to pay our bills.

A letter from Lester Synoway was read. It was about knocked over stones, new trees and fence repair. He'd also like \$60 a month.

Herb Usick will contact Delbert Lambrecht about fixing the fence and keeping his share fixed.

Emlyn Lathoff made the motion + Carme Susptel seconded it that we raise Lester Synoway's wage to \$60 a month. Motion carried.

Discussion of the map and a marking system to find the grave easier ended with Chuck Price

being appointed Chairman &

LAMBRECHT CEMETARY

One hundred and thirteen years ago, on April 21, 1883 our Lambrecht Cemetery originated. Pleasant View was the name given it then but it was referred to as the Tawney Cemetery. Church services were held across the road in the Tawney school. In May 1939 the name was officially changed to Lambrecht Cemetery because it was felt the Lambrecht family deserved the recognition. A meeting was held on the August Lambrecht homestead when August donated one acre in the northwest corner of the farm in exchange for a lot. The lots were 18 ft. square and could be bought for \$1.50 each. This was official October 1, 1883. Joe Forsythe, Rufus Tawney and Herman Steinkraus were the first 3 members on the board and in 1884 Aug. Lambrecht was named the first treasurer. Those purchasing the \$1.50 lots were Rufus Tawney, Joe Forsythe, Fred Rautenberg, Julius Schultz, Chris Schram, R.H. Smith, Frank Birek, Dave Kuther, Carl Leisner, Herman Steinkraus, Albert Steinkraus, L. Poynter, Chas Uhrick, Aug. Hoyer, S.W. Kincaid, George Kincaid, I.C. and L.A. Barnes and, of course, Aug. Lambrecht.

W.E. Bishop was paid \$5.00 to survey the land. In 1885 a fire line was plowed and Frank Birch was paid \$4.50 for trees and planting them. The woven fence was put there in 1898 costing \$156.81.

In 1917 the board was Mrs. Mary Voecks, Mrs. Jane Birch and Mrs. Sophie Keller. In later years officers were Kincaid, Poynter, King, Robert Ruhlow, Kerr, J. Sonith, Barnes, Theo Synovec, Fred Synovec, Albert Buss, Ernest Lambrecht, Hy Kuhl and Homer Birch. After 1924 Frank Voecks were caretakers and Mary Voecks was very active in the organization looking after the plot where her parents and many pioneers were laid to rest. It can be noted that her son Herbert was also an active member and attended every meeting until a couple of years before his death.

Roy Synovec started mowing the cemetery in 1958 and he has been doing it ever since. Lester Synovec is now doing the mowing. Tillie Synovec was chairman of the association from 1950 to 1980. While she was chairman she worked real hard collecting money for operations. I have the old book from 1923 on showing the dues were \$1.00 until about 1940 they went to \$2.00 later going to \$3.00 and \$5.00. In looking back it appears the lots went for \$10.00 and now can be purchased for \$50.00.

Throughout the years I found the mowing and raking was done by Ernest Voecks for \$5.00, Hy and Gerhart Kuhl for \$5.00, L.E. Walton, Phillip Lambrecht and Frank Voecks were paid \$2.50 in 1943. Neal Buchanan and Anton Leisner mowed and raked for \$11.00 and \$13.00 in 1946. In 1949 and 1950 Anton Synovec got \$15.00 and \$20.00. Otto Nathan got \$10.000. In 1951 it cost \$26.00 for mowing (don't know who). Then in 1952 Herb Voecks got \$40.00. Beginning in 1960 Tillie was paid \$25.00 the first mowing and \$20.00 after. At the present time Lester is paid \$75.00 the first time and \$65.00 after that.

The only record I found of officers was Henrietta Lambrecht and Martha Steinkraus as Treasurer. In 1968 Shirely Hoffman was elected Secretary and Winell Suckstorf as Treasurer. We are both Great-Granddaughters of August Lambrecht. In 1984 Betty Leisner was named chairman to replace Tillie Synovec. Betty is a daughter of Anton and Gwen Synovec.

In 1981 Arlen Voecks spent many hours drawing a new map. It was really needed and he did a really good job.

In 1940 a bronze plaque on a huge native boulder was erected and in 1982 a new entrance arch of steel bearing the words "Lambrecht Cemetery 1883-1983" was placed at the gate. It was donated by Herb and Leona Voecks, a granddaughter of August Lambrecht and erected by Herb, his son Gary and Arlen Voecks & Chuck Price.

Right now there are several generations buried there Aug. Lambrecht, Ernest and Leona Voecks, and Arlen Voecks with lots reserved for Chuck and Arlene Price and their boys Rod and Dave. Another is Aug. Lambrecht, Hy and Minnie Kuhl, Albert and Louise Buss with lots reserved for Clarence and Winell Suckstorf. Also, Aug. Lambrecht and Ernest and Signe Lambrecht. Also, Aug. Lambrecht, Frank and Mary Voecks, Harold Voecks and his son Dan. Also Carl and Emma Suckstorf and their children Martin and Christina. Fred Synovec, Anton and Gwen Synovec and several of their children. Also three generations of Dave Kuthers and Gordon Kuther.

In 1995 a request was made for help in financing the expenses of keeping our cemetery looking good, like our grandparents and parents would want it to look. The response was great and our thanks to all who helped us out.

My mother Louise Buss, a granddaughter of Aug. Lambrecht was very proud of the cemetery, as we are too, and we really hope to carry on keeping it a plot to be proud of.
