MINUTES OF 2021 ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS

The 2021 Annual Meeting of the Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association of Pierce County, Nebraska, was held on Sunday, October 3, 2021, at 1:00 p.m., in the basement of the United Church of Christ, 303 South Brown Street, Pierce, Nebraska 68767. A Notice of the 2021 Annual Meeting of the Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association of Pierce County, Nebraska, had been published in the September 23 and 30, 2021 issues of the Pierce County Leader Newspaper, a legal newspaper published in Pierce County, Nebraska, prior to the meeting. The Certificate of the Clerk as to the publication is attached to these Minutes and incorporated herein by reference. (Page 5)

The following Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association were present for the 2021 Annual Meeting, to wit: Thomas Kuether, Betty Leisner, Loren Lindahl, Arlin Miller, Mardell Miller, Sharylene Riedel, Jeff Ryan, Timothy Spatz, Lynn Spatz, Gary Suckstorf, Sandy Suckstorf, Dori Walton, and Jacob Wostrel. The Clerk/Secretary stated that Neb. Rev. Stat. §12-501(4) provides that a quorum of the Members of a cemetery association shall consist of 4 or more members of such association being present at a meeting of the members of the association. As more than 4 members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association are present, the Clerk declared a quorum of the Members was present. Also present was Larry Wachholtz, a descendant of his Wachholtz ancestors buried in the Lambrecht Cemetery.

The Members were then presented a proposed Agenda for said meeting. A copy of said Agenda is attached to these Minutes and incorporated herein by reference. (Pages 6-7)

President Leisner called the Annual Meeting of the Members to order and indicated that the next item on the Agenda to be discussed was the Tombstone Restoration Project. Trustee Walton and Clerk Lindahl then introduced Jerry Nordeen of Monument Solutions, LLC. Pages from the website of Monument Solutions, LLC are attached to these Minutes. (Pages 8-12) Mr. Nordeen then gave a presentation as to the work that he will perform to various tombstones in the Lambrecht Cemetery in need of restoration based upon his inventory and survey of said tombstones on April 30, 2021. Attached to these Minutes is Mr. Nordeen's listing of the names on the tombstones in need of restoration and an estimate of costs for each tombstone in need of restoration. (Pages 13-15) Trustee Walton and Clerk Lindahl then stated that a letter had been sent to all of the Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association soliciting funds to pay for the cost of the restorations and that there had been various newspaper articles regarding the Tombstone Restoration Project. The letter and newspaper articles are attached to these minutes and incorporated herein by reference. (Pages 16-20) Trustee Walton then indicated that she had established a separate bank account at Elkhorn Valley Bank, Pierce, Nebraska, in which to place any monetary contributions for the Tombstone Restoration Project. Trustee Walton then submitted a donation list as of October 2, 2021, indicating the names of the donors to this Project and the total amount received as of that date. Said Donations List is attached to these Minutes. (Page 21) Trustee Walton and Clerk Lindahl stated that they would also be in contact with numerous known

relatives/descendants of those buried in the Lambrecht Cemetery requesting donations to the Project. Discussion then ensued about the fact that Mr. Nordeen will commence work on the Lambrecht Cemetery Tombstone Restoration Project in the spring of 2022 and that it will be completed before the winter of 2022. There was also discussion as to the placement of restored tombstones out of the alleys in the Lambrecht Cemetery and into an adjacent Burial Space but the consensus of the Members present was to leave the tombstones needing restoration in their present location. After Mr. Nordeen's presentation, he was excused and left the meeting.

The Clerk offered to read the Minutes of the prior Annual Meeting of the Members and prior meetings of the Trustees but the Members agreed to dispense with said readings. Copies of those Minutes are attached to these Minutes. (Pages 22-35) The Members' Directory was reviewed and updated. A revised Members' Directory is attached to these Minutes. (Pages 36-37) Also, the Secretary's Record Book from May 26, 1946 to August 18, 2019 was discussed. The Members were of the opinion that said Secretary's Record Book should be given to the Pierce County Historical Society for preservation. The Clerk gave the Secretary's Record Book to Sharylene Riedel for delivery to the Pierce County Historical Society.

The Treasurer's Financial Report was then given by Trustee Walton. Since there had been no Annual Meeting of the Members in calendar year 2020, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, Trustee Walton presented to the Members present a 2020 Treasurer's Report and a 2021 Treasurer's Report, both of which are attached to these Minutes and incorporated herein by reference. (Pages 38-39) Member Timothy Spatz made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Financial Reports. Trustee Leisner seconded said motion. There being no further discussion, said motion was approved and President Leisner declared that the Treasurer's Financial Reports had been accepted by the Members.

President Leisner then gave a report as to the internments, mowing, and liability insurance presently being maintained for the Lambrecht Cemetery. Since the last annual meeting on August 18, 2019, to present, there had been the following internments in the Lambrecht Cemetery, to wit: Ina/Ida Leisner and Susan Ryan. The President further reported that Brice Buckendahl has done the mowing of the Lambrecht Cemetery and will continue to be so employed at a contract rate of \$125.00 per mowing with an additional fee for clean up as necessitated and directed by the Trustees. The liability insurance for the Lambrecht Cemetery is with the insurance agency of Town & Country Insurance in Pierce, Nebraska, and will be renewed for an additional year and the premium paid accordingly.

The Members then discussed a motion to ratify all prior acts and conduct of the Trustees/Officers of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association from August 18, 2019 to present. Trustee Walton made a motion to that effect, which was seconded by Member Gary Suckstorf. There being no further discussion, the Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association unanimously approved said motion and President Leisner declared the motion adopted.

The Members then reviewed the expenses and donations for the general maintenance of the Lambrecht Cemetery for 2022 as indicated on the aforementioned Treasurer's Reports and determined that there would be no assessment of the Members in 2022 for said general maintenance expenses.

The next agenda item was possible action regarding the number of Members to be Trustees. The Clerk stated that Neb. Rev. Stat. §12-501(4) states that the Members of a Cemetery Association may elect any number of their Members, not less than 3, to serve as Trustees, and 1 Member to serve as Clerk, all of whom shall continue in office at the pleasure of the Members of the Association, said Trustees to have perpetual succession pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §12-503. The current Trustees are Betty Leisner, Tom Kuether, and Dori Walton. Loren Lindahl is the Clerk. The Members then discussed adding two additional Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association to be Trustees in addition to the ones already mentioned. Upon motion made by Sharylene Riedel, and seconded by Mardell Miller, Jacob Wostrel and Jeff Ryan were elected as additional Trustees of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association. The Trustees indicated they would meet after the Members meeting and elect among themselves Trustees to the offices of President, Vice President, and Treasurer. The aforementioned Clerk would serve as the Secretary of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association.

The Members then moved onto new business. The first item of New Business was establishing a timeframe for the annual meeting of the Members. The consensus of the Members is that the annual meeting of the members for 2022, and hopefully for succeeding years, will be in a period of time from the end of May to the first part of June each year. The Clerk reminded the Members that the first publication of the Notice of the Annual Meeting of the Members is to be at least 15 days prior to the Annual Meeting. The Members then discussed that there would be no payment for the positions of the Trustees, Clerk, and Officers of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association. The other items on the Agenda under New Business were passed over at this Annual Meeting except for the last item of adding additional real estate to the Lambrecht Cemetery grounds. It was indicated that the trees on the west, south, and east side of the Cemetery are actually on the land owned by the adjoining property owner, Chris Unseld. Tom Keuther indicated that he would visit with Chris Unseld in regard to the Lambrecht Cemetery Association's continued use of said area and/or the possible deeding of said area containing those aforementioned trees to the Lambrecht Cemetery Association.

Trustee Walton then indicated that she would like a metal sign to be made and placed on the entrance gate to the Lambrecht Cemetery grounds indicating the timeframe in which grave decorations would be permitted and/or not permitted on the Cemetery grounds. Member Jacob Wostrel volunteered that he would be responsible for having the sign professionally manufactured, placed on the Cemetery entrance gate, and would pay all costs associated with the sign and its placement. Trustee Walton made a motion that an approximate 18" x 24" inch metal sign be professionally made for the gate of the Cemetery to indicate the dates by which decorations were to be removed and that Member Wostrel be responsible for its manufacture, placement, and costs. Said motion was seconded by Member Gary Suckstorf. There being no further discussion, all Members present voted in favor of said Motion and the President declared said motion adopted.

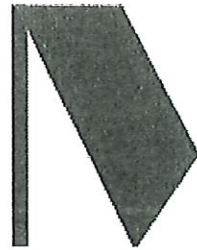
The condition of the entrance gate was also discussed. Trustee Keuther stated that he would investigate the replacement of the gate and submit his report to the Trustees.

There being no further business to be conducted, the 2021 Annual Meeting of the Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association was adjourned at 2:05 p.m. Immediately thereafter, the Trustees and Clerk met and agreed that the current officers would remain in their respective office until death, resignation, or the next meeting of the Trustees/Clerk, whichever occurs first. There were no other decisions or discussion among the Trustees and Clerk. A Directory of the current Trustees/Clerk/Officers of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association is attached to these Minutes. (Page 40)

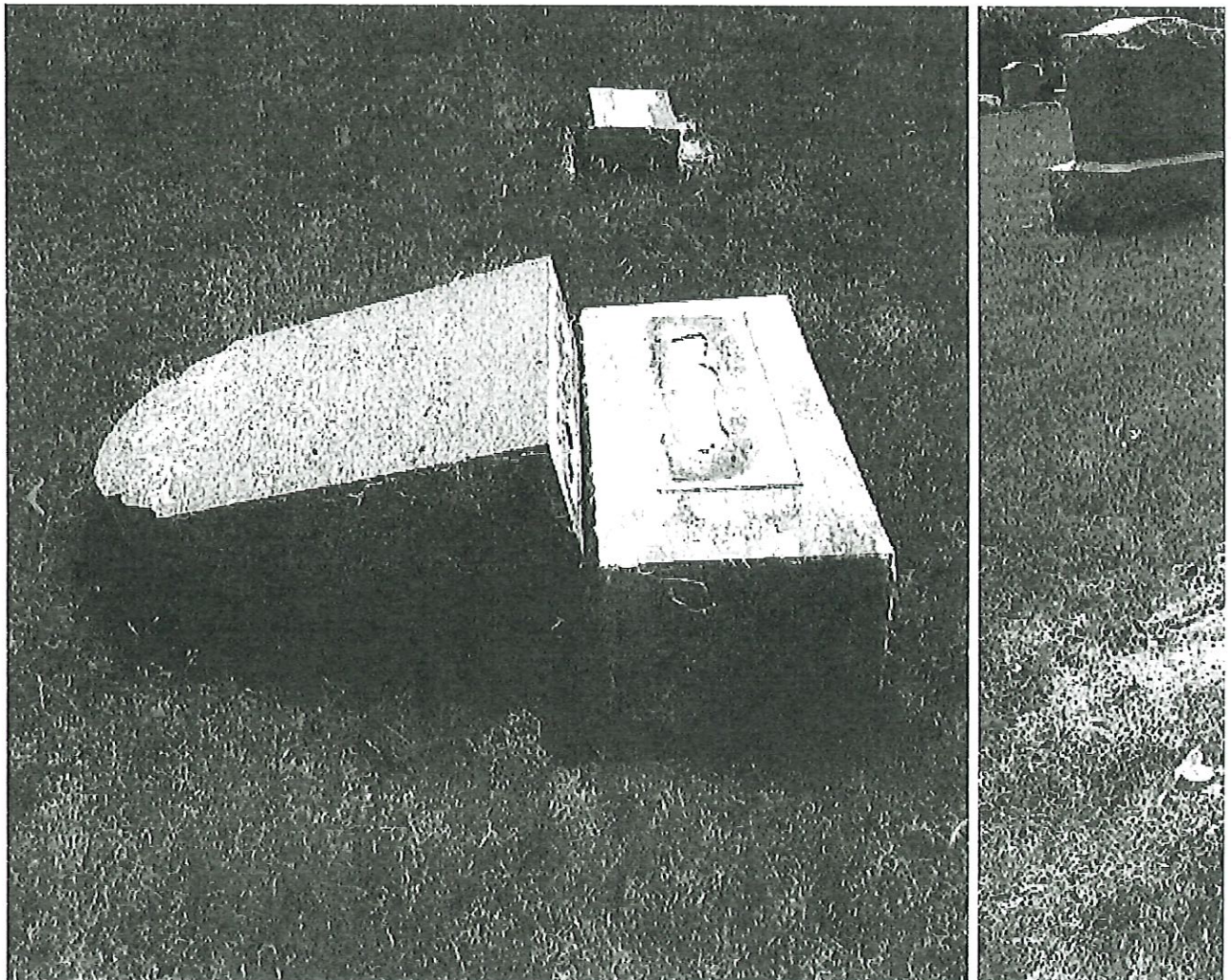

Dear Lambrecht Cemetery Association Member:

Please be advised that you are receiving this letter due to your ownership of one or more burial spaces in the Lambrecht Cemetery. As you can see from the



photos, our cemetery is not presenting itself at its best. Numerous tombstones are leaning and some are to the point of falling over.

Monument Solutions, LLC, a cemetery preservation company located in Norfolk, Nebraska, has conducted, at the behest of the Trustees/Officers of the Association, an inventory of all of the tombstones located in the Lambrecht Cemetery. Monument

Solutions, LLC indicates that there are at least 75 tombstones that are in need of attention/restoration. The cost to reset and restore those tombstones is estimated to be \$11,000.00.

The Lambrecht Cemetery Association receives no county or city funding. Its finances come from donations received from a few loyal Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association. Those donations help to cover the annual cost of mowing the grass in the Lambrecht Cemetery. Unfortunately, there is not enough money in our treasury to cover the cost of the restoration. As Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association, we need to come together to raise funds to cover the expense of the tombstone restoration so that we will have a cemetery/resting place we can be proud of.

The Lambrecht Cemetery Association Trustees/Officers have established a Lambrecht Cemetery Association Restoration account at Elkhorn Valley Bank in Pierce, Nebraska, for the express purpose of paying for the cost of restoring the headstones in the cemetery. Donations to that account are needed. Donations are welcome from individuals, families, companies, or in memory of a loved one. Let's all work together to make this happen. Cemetery restoration project leads to search for descendants

Efforts are underway to improve a nearly 140-year-old cemetery in rural Pierce County.

The search is on for descendants of the early settlers who are buried at Lambrecht Cemetery — located about 10 miles west of Pierce along the Pierce-Neligh road — in hopes that they might be interested in helping with the project.

"Essentially there are numerous orphaned tombstones," said Loren Lindahl, who's great-grandparents donated land to the cemetery. "There is no family left to keep them up."

The cemetery was established in 1883, after early settlers August and Louise Lambrecht lost two small children to diphtheria. No cemetery existed in the area at that time, so the Lambrechts — as Lindahl has read — buried their children in a tree line on their homestead.

Talk among the neighbors began the following spring about organizing a cemetery; the Lambrechts donated an acre for such a use, and then neighbors formed what was then known as the Pleasant View Cemetery Association.

The Lambrechts' children were disinterred, and their remains were relocated to their new burial plots. Other early residents of that area who died before the establishment of Lambrecht Cemetery were disinterred from their temporary graves and relocated, as well, Lindahl said.

"Even though the Lambrecht children were the first buried here, there are graves of some who died before them here because of that reason," Lindahl said.

Over the years, the Lambrecht Cemetery also was referred to as the Tawney Cemetery to reflect its location to the nearby Tawney schoolhouse. In the late

1930s, some Lambrecht relatives and other members of the association changed its name to Lambrecht Cemetery to honor the original family buried there, Lindahl said.

The grounds include space for up to 800 burials, but only about 130 burials have occurred there, according to records Lindahl has found. It continues to be used today. One of its most recent interments occurred in 2019.

Lambrecht Cemetery Association members are those who have purchased burial spaces. Lindahl said upkeep at the cemetery has been done through assessments on lots that were purchased.

"I'd say within the last 40 years or so, there hasn't been any assessment, but they have asked for donations or certain people have donated to the cemetery association, and that money has been used for maintenance," Lindahl said. "That maintenance has just been applied toward mowing the grass, trimming the trees. The fence was money that was donated, and the labor was donated."

But now many of the gravemarkers and tombstones are in need of resetting and restoration. A total of 75 monuments are in need of attention. An estimate for the project by Monument Solutions of Norfolk put the cost at roughly \$11,000.

"As you can see ... our cemetery is not presenting itself at its best," the association's treasurer, Dori Walton, said in a letter to association members. "Numerous tombstones are leaning, and some are to the point of falling over."

The letter sent out to members of the cemetery association to let them know about the efforts to raise the estimated funds to complete the project, as well as the establishment of the cemetery restoration fund at Elkhorn Valley Bank in Pierce.

Lindahl said he knows Lambrecht Cemetery's situation is not unique. Many rural cemeteries are governed by an association that relies on assessments, donations and memorials for upkeep, and as those cemeteries fill up or spaces are no longer purchased, the funds for upkeep dry up.

Lindahl and members of the cemetery board also are hoping to find descendants of early settlers that might be willing to donate to the project. Lindahl said his cousin in Las Vegas has taken on the task to find some of the descendants through family searches using online genealogy resources.

"Those ancestors' tombstones most likely need restoration," he said.

With the efforts underway, the association already has raised roughly \$4,000, about a quarter of which came from Rick and Dori Walton in honor of those who have been laid to rest but have no family to help cover the cost of their tombstone restoration.

Lindahl — who does not intend to be buried in Lambrecht Cemetery one day — said he is passionate about seeing the project completed because he and others he knows have ancestors and loved ones laid to their eternal rest, and he wants to make sure their final resting place is well-kept.

"We all want to be buried in a cemetery that looks nice," Lindahl said.

MEETINGS OF CLERK/TRUSTEES

2021

Several meetings of the Clerk and Trustees of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association via personal conversations and/or via telephone, and/or emails or text were conducted during the Winter, Spring and Summer of 2021. The Clerk and the Trustees are Shirley Hoffman, Clerk, Betty Leisner, Tom Kuether, and Dori Walton, Trustees. Unfortunately, the Clerk, Shirley Hoffman, died on April 17, 2021. The office of Clerk remained unfilled until a special election was conducted in the Summer of 2021 via means of a letter ballot (attached) being sent to each member of the Association with instructions for voting by each member for a member to be elected Clerk to fill the vacancy created by the death of Shirley. The results of the voting, as tabulated by Trustee Walton, were that member Loren Lindahl was elected as Clerk of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association.

During the Winter and Spring of 2021, the Trustees discussed the general appearance of the cemetery and the need for the repair/restoration of numerous tombstones in the cemetery. The Trustees authorized Dori to be in contact with Loren to coordinate an inventory of the tombstones in the Lambrecht Cemetery by Jerry Nordeen of Monument Solutions, LLC of Norfolk, NE. On April 30, 2021, Jerry Nordeen and Loren conducted that inventory. Thereafter, in June of 2021, Jerry Nordeen furnished to Loren his written cost estimate to repair numerous tombstones in the cemetery. Loren shared that written inventory with Dori who shared it with the other Trustees. That cost estimate totaled approximately \$11,750.00.

Dori then proposed the creation of a new account for the Lambrecht Cemetery Association at Elkhorn Valley Bank in Pierce, NE for all monies received by the Cemetery Association for this tombstone restoration project and for the formulation of a letter to all of the members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association requesting donations to this project. The Trustees agreed and the account was established. A letter was drafted, reviewed, revised and mailed to all members of the Cemetery Association in July of 2021 by the Trustees. Loren volunteered to contact the Norfolk Daily News newspaper of Norfolk, NE for a reporter for that newspaper to conduct an interview of Loren at the Lambrecht Cemetery as to this project. The reporter's article was published in the August 12, 2021 issue of the Norfolk Daily News. Other letters requesting funds for this tombstone restoration project were prepared and sent to other persons interested in this project. Beth Kuhl Peterson, a member of the Cemetery Association living in Las Vegas, NV volunteered to search for living descendants of various people buried in the Lambrecht Cemetery, whose tombstone is in need of restoration, for whom there is no known descendant living in the area. Those living descendants would then be contacted and encouraged to contribute towards the cost of the repair of their ancestor's tombstone. To date, from all of the aforementioned various methods utilized to contact people for donations, \$10,245.00 has been raised for this project.

The Clerk and the Trustees then discussed a date, time, and place for the 2021 Annual Meeting of the members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association. It was determined that the 2021 Annual Meeting of the members would be on Sunday, October 3, 2021 at 1:00PM at the United Church of Christ Church, 303 South Brown Street, Pierce, NE. Dori contacted the Pierce County Leader newspaper to publish a notice of the meeting. Dori also agreed to be in contact with all members of the Cemetery Association having a NE address and Loren would be in contact with all members of the Cemetery Association having an out of state address informing them of the 2021 Annual Meeting.

Even numbered addresses can water on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Odd numbered

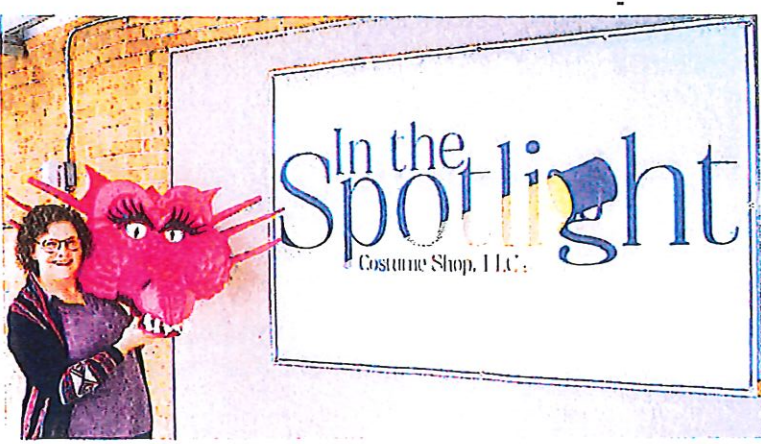
addresses can water on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. There will be NO watering on Sundays.

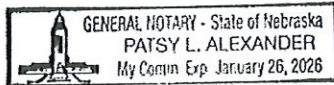

Loren also noted the six issues of the Lambrecht Cemetery Newsletter which began in February of 2022. Lynn indicated that she was not receiving it. This will be looked into by Loren and Lynn.

The Treasurer's Financial Report was then given by the Treasurer, Dori. Dori presented the 2022 Treasurer's Report in written form which is attached to these Minutes and incorporated herein by reference. Member Jacob made a motion to approve the 2022 Treasurer's Report. Betty seconded said motion. There being no further discussion, said motion was approved by the Members and President Betty declared the motion adopted. Dori also presented an updated Lambrecht Cemetery Tombstone Restoration Project Donation List, a copy of which is attached to these Minutes.

President Betty then gave a report as to the internments, purchases, mowing, and liability insurance presently being maintained for the Lambrecht Cemetery. Since the 2021 Annual meeting on October 1, 2021, to present, there had been the following internments in the Lambrecht Cemetery, to wit: **Deon Lambrecht** and **Duane Jelinek**. **Mary E. Birch** has purchased a Burial Space in the Birch Lot 60 of the Cemetery. Betty further reported that Brice Buckendahl mowed the grasses of the Lambrecht Cemetery seven times in 2022 and will continue to be so employed at a contract rate of \$125.00 per mowing with an additional fee/surcharge for an increase in fuel costs and/or clean up as necessitated and directed by the Trustees. The liability insurance policy for the Lambrecht Cemetery is with Farmers Mutual of Nebraska Insurance Company through the insurance agency of Town & Country Insurance in Pierce, Nebraska, and will be renewed for an additional year and the premium of \$50.00 paid accordingly. Jacob was thanked by the Members present for the preparation, costs, and placement of the sign at the entrance of the Lambrecht Cemetery stating the Association's policy regarding the timeframe in which grave decorations would be permitted and/or not permitted on the Cemetery grounds.

The Members then discussed a motion to ratify all prior acts and conduct of the Trustees/Officers of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association from October 1, 2021 to present. Dori made a motion to that effect, which was seconded by Tom. There being no further discussion, the Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association unanimously approved said motion and President Betty declared the motion adopted.

The Members then moved onto new business. The Members discussed a meeting date for the Annual Meeting of the Members. Dori moved that the Annual Meeting date be in the month of October with the Trustees/Officers setting the actual date, time, and place of the meeting, notice of the meeting date, time, and place to be published at least fifteen days prior to the meeting date in one or more legal newspapers published in Pierce County, Nebraska. Lynn seconded this motion. After discussion, all Members present voted to approve this motion. President Betty declared the motion adopted.

The Members then reviewed the expenses and donations for the general maintenance of the Lambrecht Cemetery for 2022 as indicated on the Treasurer's Report of 2022 and determined that there would be no assessment of the Members in 2022 for said general maintenance expenses.

All Officers stated that they would not accept any monetary compensation for their services to the Lambrecht Cemetery Association though they would be entitled to be reimbursed for their out of pocket expenses. Also, the Trustees, as a whole, would agree to act as the Sexton of the Lambrecht Cemetery. The fee for the purchase of a burial space would remain at \$100.00.

The condition of the main entrance gate to the Cemetery was also discussed. Tom stated that an anonymous donor had approached him who was willing to pay for the cost of the manufacture of a new gate for the main entrance to the Lambrecht Cemetery, based on a design of the gate proposed by Tom and agreed to by the Members present, the Cemetery Association to pay for the cost of its installation. Dori moved that Tom be authorized to work with the anonymous donor in the manufacture of this gate, based upon the design submitted by Tom, and that after its

manufacture, the Cemetery Association pay or furnish the labor for the installation of the gate. Jacob seconded the motion. After discussion, all Members present voted in favor of the motion and President Betty declared the motion adopted.

The dirt pile in the southwest corner of the Cemetery was then discussed. Tom indicated that he had been in contact with the adjacent landowner, Chris Unseld, who agree that Tom, by removing a portion of the Cemetery's fence near the dirt pile, would be able to take a majority of the dirt from the dirt pile and spread it onto the Unseld land. Tom will leave a smaller dirt pile in the southwest corner of the Cemetery for future maintenance purposes on the Cemetery grounds. All Members present thanked Tom for his efforts in getting the dirt pile issue resolved.

Loren then stated that he was looking at a computer software program called Crypt-Keeper for purposes of keeping records for the Cemetery. There is an internet version for which there is an annual fee but permits multiple users or a desktop version for which there is a one-time fee but allows only one user. Though there was not great enthusiasm among the other Members present as to this program, Loren volunteered to donate the fee for the internet version and to work with the program, with others who may be interested in keeping these records for the Cemetery, and report at the next Annual Meeting the success or non-success of the venture.

Dori then stated that she would like to see the Cemetery's road frontage fence improved by raising it slightly so the vegetation under it could be cut and to also change the fence posts from the current "t" steel posts to more decorative posts in an effort to enhance the appearance of the Cemetery. All Members present stated that they would be in favor of that proposal. Dori is to work with the Trustees and other Members on this project.


Though not specifically an Agenda item, it was mentioned by the Members that there are several unmarked "known" burials in the Cemetery based upon notations on the Bishop and Voecks' plats of the Cemetery and previous "witching" in the area of these notations. The Members agreed that those unmarked "known" burial sites should be marked with permanent stone markers. Loren agree to determine the costs of the stone markers and the number required and report back to the Members his findings.

There being no further old or new business to discuss, all matters on the Agenda having been discussed and acted upon or passed over, Betty then announced that effective at the close of this Annual Meeting, she was resigning as an Officer of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association. She stated that she would continue as a Trustee of the Association. Betty has been continuously since 1983 the President/Chair of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association. The Members present thanked Betty for her years of service to the Lambrecht Cemetery Association. Thereafter, Lynn made a motion to accept Betty's resignation as President of the Cemetery Association, to elect Tom, who is the current Vice-President, as President, and to elect Jeff as Vice-President. Jacob seconded the motion. All Members present voted in favor of the motion and Betty declared the motion adopted.

Betty further stated that even though she is not continuing as President, the United Church of Christ Fellowship Hall may still be used as a meeting place for future Annual Meetings of the Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association.

There being no further business to be conducted, the 2022 Annual Meeting of the Members of the Lambrecht Cemetery Association was adjourned by Betty at 2:10 p.m.
